## Program Pricing for 2023-24

## Program Cost

The program fees listed below are paid directly to Eagle Academy via our online payment system and are utilized in paying for our host facility, insurance, and miscellaneous school needs throughout the year.

Early Application Fee, if enrolled by March 31, 2023

- $\$ 175$ for first student
- $\$ 125$ for second student from same family
- $\$ 100$ for each additional student

Standard Application Fee, if enrolled by April 30, 2023

- $\$ 225$ for first student
- $\$ 175$ for second student from same family
- \$100 for each additional student

Summer Application Fee, if enrolled May 1, 2023 or after

- \$275 for first student
- $\$ 225$ for second student from same family
- \$100 for each additional student

Senior Fee

## Tuition

Tuition fees will be paid directly to instructors via our online payment system.

Eagle Academy recommends paying instructors in quarterly payments which are initiated on August 1, October 1, January 1, and March 1. Payment in full is available should you desire.

## Class Fees

Several of our classes need additional supplies and have an associated class fee. If a class has a fee associated with it, the fee will be listed in the course description. Science fees are paid to Eagle Academy to cover lab supplies and are collected at the same time as paying your application fee. All other class fees are paid directly to instructors and are paid at the time you pay tuition.

## Study Hall Fees

Study halls are monitored by and adult and are an opportunity for students to complete academic assignments. Students are NOT to use study hall times to take exams or quizzes. Study hall fees are \$25/ semester, are payable in full, and are collected online at the same time as paying your application fee.

## Refunds \& Insufficient Funds

Registration fees, tuition, class fees, and study hall fees are all non-refundable. The Eagle Board and instructors have to make decisions and purchases based on how many students are enrolled. Prayerfully consider enrolling in Eagle Academy and the classes on offer in light of this financial commitment.

## Course Descriptions

## English and Literature Department

Our middle school through 9th grade English courses are from the Institute for Excellence in Writing. IEW is an exceptional skill-building program, which requires an incremental, working knowledge of the course's development. The entry-level class, English Structure \& Style Level B, is recommended for any middle school student taking IEW for the first time, regardless of their grade level.

Literature books are listed in order of their use throughout the school year and can be purchased or rented from the library. Please be sure to obtain these books in advance so your student is properly prepared for class assignments.

## Classics Club

Middle School students will enjoy this discussion-based class featuring several beloved classics. Homework will consist of reading the books at home and class time will feature guided discussion. The aim of this class is to introduce students to understanding and analyzing literature using Socratic questioning and to have them become familiar with some of the best authors of the $20^{\text {th }}$ century. A book project will be due after the completion of each book.

## Ancient History

## Chemistry

## Logic II

Logic II is a continuation of Logic I, and is a one-semester course designed to be a high school course introducing the student to formal logic and the mysterious world of syllogisms. The primary goal of the course is to make the student aware of the language of formal logic, much like the language a student learns when taking algebra for the first time. Students must learn the rules for how Statements are constructed, and how to write them correctly using the only verb that is allowed. (You will find out the one and only verb allowed.) Students will learn what these terms mean and how to use them: the square of opposition, supported statements, truth and validity, and of course, what a syllogism is. The standard example of a syllogism is this combination of 3 sentences:

> A) All men are mortal
> B) Socrates was a man,
> C)Therefore, Socrates is mortal

After learning how to translate normal English statements into syllogisms, students will be able to determine which syllogisms are valid, and which are not. And here's the secret: out of 256 possible combinations of categorical statements, only 24 are valid combinations! Amazing...
