Program Pricing for 2024-25

Program Cost

The program fees listed below are paid directly to Eagle Academy via our online payment system and are utilized in paying for our host facility, insurance, and miscellaneous school needs throughout the year.

Early Application Fee, if enrolled by March 22, 2024

- \$175 for first student
- \$125 for second student from same family
- \$100 for each additional student

Standard Application Fee, if enrolled by April 30, 2024

- \$225 for first student
- \$175 for second student from same family
- \$100 for each additional student

Summer Application Fee, if enrolled May 1, 2024 or after

- \$275 for first student
- \$225 for second student from same family

Tuition fees will be paid directly to instructors via our online payment system.

Eagle Academy recommends paying instructors in quarterly payments, which are initiated on August 1, October 1, January 1, and March 1. Payment-in-full is also an available option, if desired.

Class Fees

Several of our classes need additional supplies and have an associated class fee. If a class has a fee associated with it, the fee will be listed in the course description. Science fees are paid to Eagle Academy to cover lab supplies and are collected at the same time as paying your application fee. All other class fees are paid directly to instructors and are paid at the time you pay tuition.

Study Hall Fees

Study halls are monitored by and adult and are an opportunity for students to complete academic assignments. Students are **NOT** to use study hall times to take exams or quizzes. **Study hall fees are \$25**/ **semester**, are payable in full, and are collected online at the same time as paying your application fee.

Refunds & Insufficient Funds

Registration fees, tuition, class fees, and study hall fees are all non-refundable. The Eagle Board and instructors have to make decisions and purchases based on how many students are enrolled. Prayerfully consider enrolling in Eagle Academy and the classes on offer in light of this financial commitment.

If at anytime your account has insufficient funds, a fee will be charged in accordance with any bank charges incurred by Eagle Academy or an instructor.

Course Descriptions

English and Literature Department

Our middle school through 9th grade English courses are from the Institute for Excellence in Writing. IEW is an exceptional skill-building program, which requires an incremental, working knowledge of the course's development. The entry-level class, English Structure & Style Level B, is recommended for any middle school student taking IEW for the first time, regardless of their grade level.

Literature books are listed in order of their use throughout the school year and can be purchased or rented from the library. Please be sure to obtain these books in advance so your student is properly prepared for class assignments.

Classics Club

Middle School students will enjoy this discussion-based class featuring several beloved classics. Homework will consist of reading the books at home and class time will feature guided discussion. The aim of this class is to introduce students to understanding and analyzing literature using Socratic questioning and to have them become familiar with some of the best authors of the 20th century. A book project will be due after the completion of each book.

Survey of World History

This course is designed for upper-level high school students to practice and develop independent learning. Algebra 1

The *Algebra 1* level of Math-U-See continues seamlessly from Pre-Algebra and covers graphing, simultaneous equations, exponents, polynomials, unit multipliers, and more. Fine Arts Department

Drawing

Instruction for Drawing class is based on "Drawing from the Right Side of the Brain," a technique that allows students to draw what they see instead of what they think they see. Our early drawing of a house might be a square with a triangle on top. While that drawing is a representation of a house, it is not what a house really looks like. This technique gives instruction on how to draw the intricate details that make a drawing look "real," while also enabling the students to portray their projects with perspective and proportion. As the year progresses, they will learn shading techniques, which give depth and value to a drawing. Students will also be instructed on how to effectively use other mediums such as pen, ink, and colored pencils. After a few basic drawings are completed, students will be allowed to choose from other materials supplied and will progress at their own speed. Students will be required to choose their own drawing references each week, either by printing them at home and bringing them to class, or by emailing the instructor 48 hours before class so they can be printed and brought in for them. Based on specific supply needs, this class has no homework requirement (resulting in no HAS Forms), which produces a deficit in hours to fulfill a high school Fine Arts Elective credit. Parents are encouraged to combine the 32 class-time hours with other, outside activities in order to reach a half or full credit.
